

SHORTER SCRIPT SAMPLE

Scene 1

Bethlehem town square

(As the **intro music** plays **(track 9)** the cast enters and all sit to the sides of the empty stage.)

Narrator #1 Welcome to Bethlehem, a town that you have all heard of. Our story is

one you will all know too....well, sort of! It begins 2000 years ago, when

Bethlehem was about to get rather busy!

(A town crier enters, carrying a hand bell and a scroll. S/he rings the bell and unrolls the scroll.)

Town Crier Hear ye! Innkeepers and landlords, gather round! Bethlehem is

about to get rather busy!

(All the innkeepers enter and excitedly swamp the town crier. They fire questions along the lines of, "What's happened?" / "What's this about?" / "What do you mean 'busy?" / "Tell us more!")

Town Crier QUIET! (handing the scroll to Innkeeper #1 and exiting) It's all in here. I'm off for

a lie-down!

Innkeeper #1 (reading) It says Bethlehem is going to get lots of visitors!

Innkeeper #2 (snatching the scroll and reading) They're coming for the census!

Innkeeper #3 (snatching the scroll and reading) Hundreds of them!

Innkeeper #4 They'll want to rent our rooms!

Innkeeper #5 Only if our inns are up-to-scratch!

All Innkeepers TIME TO GET BUSY!

(As the song's intro plays, the innkeepers fetch brooms, cloths, tools and paint brushes.)

song Good As New

Track 1 - vocal demo Track 10 - backing track Lyrics p15 **Narrator# 2** Guests would pay top prices for the best rooms in town, so the innkeepers all hurried off to do a little spring-cleaning.

(The innkeepers exit as the **intro music** plays (**track 11**). The stage is made ready for the next scene.)

Scene 2

The 'Bethlehem B&B Bulletin' office

(Fade the music when ready. Three officers sit at a table, reading letters.)

Narrator# 3 So, 2000 years ago, when people travelled, they liked to leave reviews

about the places they stayed at, like you do on Trip Advisor these days.

Narrator #1 And when people stayed in Bethlehem, they would send their reviews to

the 'BBBB' - the Bethlehem B&B Bulletin. (pointing to the stage) This is

their office.

Officer #1 (sifting through the pile of letters) Look at all these reviews!

Officer #2 Listen to this one: (reading a letter) 'Caesar's Palace Guesthouse is THE

best place to stay in Bethlehem!' They've given it five stars!

Officer #3 (reading a letter) This one isn't so friendly: 'The Happy Donkey Inn is

RUBBISH. I'd rather sleep in a stable!' One star – oh dear!

Officer #1 (writing on a scroll) I'll add those two to the list of reviews, then...(finishing

writing and holding up the scroll)...IT'S READY TO GO PUBLIC!

(The town crier enters, takes the scroll and exits. The three officers stand.)

All 3 Officers Lunchtime!

(As the **intro music** plays **(track 12)**, the stage is cleared.)

Scene 3

Bethlehem town square

(Fade the music when ready. The town crier enters, carrying the hand bell and the scroll. S/he rings the bell and unrolls the scroll.)

Town Crier Hear ye! Hear ye! The latest reviews of your inns have gone live!

(All the innkeepers enter and excitedly swamp the town crier. They fire questions along the lines of, "How many stars do we have?" / "Who's come out on top?" / "Did anyone mention our rats?)

Town Crier QUIET! (handing the scroll to Innkeeper #6 and exiting) It's all in here. I'm off for

a lie-down!

Innkeeper #6 (reading) Humph! As usual, guess which inn got all the good reviews....

Innkeeper #7 (snatching the scroll and reading) Caesar's Palace Guesthouse! Surprise,

surprise!

Innkeeper #8 (snatching the scroll and reading) While the rest of us got bad reviews...again!

(One innkeeper, Silas, and his wife, Sapphira, arrogantly step forward. Silas takes the scroll and

gleefully reads it.)

Silas 'Caesar's Palace Guesthouse is THE best place to stay in Bethlehem!'

Sapphira And that's why we're always fully-booked!

Narrator #2 Silas and Sapphira, who owned Caesar's Palace Guesthouse, always

received rave reviews in the BBBB. And boy, how they liked to sing

about it.....

song Our Inn's Better Than Your Inn

Track 2 - vocal demo Track 13 - backing track Lyrics p16

(The other innkeepers exit, leaving Silas and Sapphira looking pleased with themselves.)

Silas Sapphira, my dear, our plan is working!

Sapphira Yes, Silas! Soon we're going to be rich!

(Both exit with a sinister 'Mwa-ha-ha!')

Narrator #3 You see, for months Silas and Sapphira had been writing fake reviews

and sending them to the BBBB, pretending they were from real visitors!

Narrator #3 They wrote glowing reviews for their own inn and really nasty ones for

the other inns!

Narrator #1 Everyone coming to Bethlehem would see these reviews and want to

stay at Caesar's Palace. Silas and Sapphira were cashing-in!

(As the intro music plays (track 14), the stage is made ready for the next scene.)

Scene 4

Mary's house

(Fade the music when ready. Mary sits alone on a stool.)

Now, many miles away in the village of Nazareth, there lived a young

woman named Mary.

Narrator #2 God sent his angel, Gabriel, to visit her with some important news...

(To the opening bars of the next song, Gabriel enters and stands by Mary. As verse 2 begins, Joseph enters.)

song Side By Side

Track 3 - vocal demo Track 15 - backing track Lyrics p17

The song contains spoken narration and dialogue, as well as sung lyrics, which tell of Mary and Joseph's journey to Bethlehem.

(As the song finishes, Joseph fetches the donkey. He takes Mary's hand.)

Joseph We're off to Bethlehem, Mary. I hope there's somewhere nice to stay!

(As the **intro music** plays **(track 16)**, Joseph and Mary exit and the stage is made ready for the next scene.)

Scene 5

The Happy Donkey Inn

(Fade the music when ready. Samuel and Sarah sit centre stage. They look glum.)

Narrator #3 Back in Bethlehem, Samuel and Sarah, owners of a little inn called The

Happy Donkey, were down in the dumps.

Samuel I don't understand, Sarah? The people who have stayed here have

always seemed happy with our inn.

Sarah I know, Samuel. But these rotten reviews are driving guests away!

Narrator #1 If things carried on like this, pretty soon The Happy Donkey Inn would

have to close down!

song An Innkeeper's Life

Track 4 - vocal demo Track 17 - backing track Lyrics p18

(As the song finishes, Samuel and Sarah exit, heads bowed. As the **intro music** plays **(track 18)**, the stage is made ready for the next scene.)
